ALGERIA: THE CRY FROM A FIRST-GENERATION CHURCH

Algeria had a flourishing Christianity between the fifth and seventh centuries AD, which gradually disappeared after the Arab invasions.

Although new churches were started under French rule, since independence in 1962 an entirely local church has been born among the Berber people, growing at an astonishing rate – several thousand new believers are baptised every year.

Within this 'First-Generation Church' there is a great need for discipleship, strong biblical teaching and encouragement for believers to daily live out their new-found faith.

SAT-7 is responding to this need by broadcasting a range of programs, which are watched by around 1 million regular Algerian viewers.

Viewers can experience worship services and biblical preaching through *My Church in Algeria,* a weekly broadcast from a large, Kabyle-speaking (Berber) church in Northern Algeria.

Bible Teaching from Algeria explores the main concepts of Christianity and provide practical guidance from the Bible in answer to questions of new believers.

Free Souls features strong personal testimonies of women from Algeria and other North African countries who tell how they chose to follow Christ, even at great personal risk.

One Algerian Berber viewer responds, "Every Tuesday night I call my friends in the village (some of them are not believers) and ask them to join my family to watch together the testimonies of brothers and sisters in *My Church* who came to know the Lord ... Please pray for salvation for all these friends. We need these kinds of programmes!"

TURKEY: THE CRY OF ISOLATED BELIEVERS

These are difficult times for the small minority of Christians in Turkey (0,5% of 77 million Turks), feeling the effects of mistrust and suspicion.

Several foreign Christian workers have been deported; churches have faced harassment from local authorities; in one city, all churches (Catholic, Protestant and Orthodox) have been ordered to close. In addition, churches have faced threats and attacks from radical Islamists.

SAT-7 TÜRK is answering the cry of these isolated believers, through encouragement, sound Christian teaching, and Christian fellowship and worship. Its dedicated team travels to different locations across Turkey and surrounding countries, meeting and interviewing Christians.

This newest channel in the SAT-7 family is becoming increasingly visible in supporting the Christian community and presenting good news to the wider community. It is the only Christian channel available on government-owned Türksat (±55 million viewers within Turkey), and since 2016, is also available on the digital subscription service D-Smart (6 million viewers).

The Preachers of Anatolia gives different church leaders from churches in small Turkish cities and towns an opportunity to discuss topics and share teachings from the Bible. 180 Degrees with Christ shares Turkish Christians' testimonies in powerful 15-minute episodes.

Prayer Time's presenters discuss issues raised by Turkish viewers, who are then encouraged and supported through prayer. ■

JAILED HOUSE CHURCH COUPLE FLEE IRANIAN AUTHORITIES

Imprisoned and blacklisted by the authorities because of their Christian activities, Arshia and his wife Mahanaz felt they had no choice but to flee Iran.

The couple shared their story with SAT-7 PARS for a special documentary filmed throughout Greece and Turkey about Iranian and Afghani Christians who have had to leave their homelands because of persecution.

The SAT-7 crew discovered that Arshia and Mahanaz had come to faith through the help of another SAT-7 staff member. They had a personal relationship with this person inside Iran, and were delighted to meet more of the SAT-7 family.

Baptized in Armenia, they returned to Iran and led a house church from their home in the mountains. The couple was discovered by the authorities, imprisoned and blacklisted. Upon their release, they were told they would be arrested again if they continued practicing their faith and would face severe consequences.

Arshia and Mahanaz felt they could not meet with other believers for fear of endangering them. Feeling silenced and isolated, the couple decided to flee Iran. Leaving everything behind, they walked for four days from Iran to Ankara, Turkey.

The couple have been living in a refugee camp for over a year now. "It is challenging," says Arshia. "However, God is good. We go to the Iranian church here and can worship freely."

A month after the filming, Arshia thanked SAT-7 for praying. He and his wife have managed to find employment in a restaurant. They are still waiting for their documents from the camp to receive permission to move on and make a home elsewhere.
